Who We Are:

Camp Misquah is an Ottawa based non-profit summer camp that provides a special residential camping experience for adults and children with special needs in a beautiful setting on Lac Bitobi near Gracefield, Quebec, about an hour north of Ottawa. With energetic staff and high staff to camper ratios, Camp Misquah has been providing amazing summer experiences for over 50 years. The Misquah Recreational Group is dedicated to providing a memorable experience to people with developmental disabilities of all ages, and to ensuring that the experience is financially accessible for all. It truly is a place where memories are made.

What We Offer:

Camp Misquah spans the shoreline of Lac Bitobi, and is lucky to have a large acreage with a long shoreline, large grassy fields, and lush woods. Campers experience the best of all worlds during their nightly walks, during activity time and especially during beach afternoon! All campers and staff live in cabins that have electricity and comfortable bunk beds. Each cabin houses 4-8 campers, and the shared space makes learning how to live, share and cooperate with others part of the day-to-day experience. Counsellors share the cabin spaces, ensuring constant supervision. Non-counselling staff stay in the same style cabins. Even though getting dirty is part of the fun at camp, Misquah is fully equipped with modern and wheelchair-accessible showers and laundry facilities, all thanks to recent fundraising efforts. Paths connect all cabins to the other camps buildings. There is also lots of room for fun and games - there is a sports pad for basketball, a soccer field for soccer and indoor and outdoor space for crafts and games. For chill moments, there are swing sets throughout the site. The dining hall seats 100 people comfortably and is also a great space for dance parties and other large group events!

Staff who work at camp will experience a summer like no other, working closely with fellow camp staff and making connections with the wonderful campers. Staff will receive training regarding camp procedures, delivery of camp programming, emergency response procedures, camper care, camper supervision and camper engagement. While working at camp, staff will gain hands-on experience in programming, inclusion and accommodations, personal care, behavior management, team-work, working outdoors, and so much more!


Who We are Looking For:

Camp Misquah is currently hiring for our 2022 summer sessions. We run summer programming through July and August. We are looking for passionate, energetic and engaging individuals to join our camp team! We have a wide range of opportunities that may appeal to those of various talents and passions. We offer work for leadership team members, program team members, counsellors, nurses, lifeguards and kitchen staff. If you are excited by the idea of working in an outdoor environment, creating close connections with co-workers and campers and are looking to make a difference this summer then Misquah is the place for you!

Contract Dates

Contracts start part time in early to mid June (mid may for leadership staff) for training provided on weekends in Ottawa and shift to full time, for onsite training and work from July 3rd to August 23rd. All staff must be available for training dates. Hiring priority is given to staff who can work the entire duration of the summer, however partial contracts may also be offered.

Camper Experience Director	Responsible for overseeing the general camper experience ensuring positive camper experiences, effective camper care, and providing guidance to the counselling team on how to best provide support to campers. Active member of the leadership team.	
Head Counsellor	Leaders of the counselling team. Provide direct, hands-on guidance, support, feedback and evaluation to the counsellors. Active member of the leadership team.	
Counsellor	Responsible for the care and well being of campers. Responsible for personal care, supervision, behavior management and engagement in programming.	
Returning Counsellor	Counsellor who has worked at Camp Misquah as a counsellor before. Responsible for the care and well being of campers. Responsible for personal care, supervision, behavior management and engagement in programming. Able to provide role-modeling to new counselling staff.	
Program Director	Responsible for the direction and oversight programming at camp such as daily themes, special guests and camp wide programming. Leads and co-ordinates the programming team (Program & Waterfront co-ordinators, program facilitators, and Lifeguards) to ensure comprehensive and quality programming for all campers. Active member of the leadership team.	
Program Facilitator	Leading and facilitating programming activities such as arts and crafts, music, sports and games to engage campers as assigned by Program Director & Program Coordinator.	
Waterfront Coordinator	Overseeing the safe operation of the waterfront and leading the lifeguarding team in waterfront supervision and programming. Support the facilitation of non-waterfront programming when the waterfront is closed. Active member of the leadership team.	
Lifeguard	Lifeguard the waterfront and facilitate waterfront programming such as swimming, boating, and beach games. Support the facilitation of non-waterfront programming when the waterfront is closed.	
Head Nurse	Leads the nursing team in ensuring safe and effective medical care to staff and campers. Provides daily medical support such as medical administration and minor first aid to staff and campers throughout the summer. Promotes and encourages personal and outdoor health in the camp environment. Provide guidance and feedback to the nursing team. Active member of the leadership team	
Nurse	Provides daily medical support such as medical administration and minor first aid to staff and campers throughout the summer. Promotes and encourages	

	personal and outdoor health in the camp environment. Active member of the leadership team
Head Cook	Oversees the safe and effective operation of the camp kitchen. Plans a food menu for the summer and completes food orders. Accommodate for a variety of allergies and dietary restrictions. Coordinates the kitchen team to prepare 3 meals a day for 100 people. Provides guidance and feedback to kitchen staff. Active member of the leadership team.
Assistant Cook	Support the head cook in planning and preparation of camp meals. Contributes to the safe and effective operation of the camp kitchen.
Porter	Complete basic meal prep tasks and washing kitchen and meal dishes. Contributes to the safe and effective operation of the camp kitchen.
Site Manager	Oversees and attends to the general safety and maintenance of the site. Performing regular cleaning of washrooms, emptying of garbage, basic repairs and other maintenance tasks. Active Member of the Leadership Team
Office Manager	Oversees and attends to the administrative tasks of camp such as financial tracking and staff payroll management. Drives the camp vehicle.

Salary Information:

All positions have a set salary range. Individual salaries are awarded within that range based on qualifications, skills and experience. Salary range for each position can be found in the job descriptions.

Salaries listed include training days and a full summer contract - staff looking to work partial contracts would have an adjusted salary.

Camp Counselor - 30 Positions

Camp Misquah is a non-profit summer residential camp experience for adults and youth with developmental disabilities in the Ottawa region. We are a residential camp where <u>campers and staff are on site 24/7 during their 5-day stay</u>.

The term of employment starts **June 15th to August 25th**, **2024**. You must be available for camp closing as well as mandatory training which runs on **June 15 -16/June 22-23** as **well as July 3 - 7 on site** and **Aug 22-23**.

JOB DESCRIPTION

- Abide by the Camp Philosophy that "Campers Come First".
- · Work at being a strong cooperative team player in your cabin and with the entire camp staff.
- Respect and support all members of your team.
- Keep the cabin clean and tidy and ensure that campers play an active role in cabin clean up
- Help generate ENTHUSIASM and IDEAS for all camp activities and encourage all members of staff to do the same.
- Aide and/or supervise the personal care tasks of each camper (feeding, dressing, bathing, and toileting) in the cabin while encouraging and insisting that the campers do all they can for themselves.
- Spend quality time with the campers at all working times.
- Share the responsibilities for advanced planning of activities, special events, and evening programs.
- Take your turn on Dorm Duty and back up Night Duty (overnight assistance)
- Be responsible for leading and initiating camp activities throughout the day.
- Work with other staff members to complete administrative tasks on time.

The term of employment is from DATE to August 25th, 2024. You must be available for camp opening and closing as well as mandatory training which run on weekends in June as well as July 3 - 6 on site and Aug 22-25.

Camp Misquah hires individuals that are looking to learn skills and gain experience related to their education or future careers, and those that want to make a difference for people with disabilities.

The skills learned on the job at Camp Misquah directly relate to nursing, social work, physiotherapy, education, psychology, speech pathology, and many more areas of study.

You will participate in daily Program to ensure the lifeguards and counsellors have the resources, training and guidance to effectively and safely guide campers in a variety of waterfront activities to encourage social interaction, physical well being, skills development and most of all FUN!

At Misquah we believe in leading by example so you can expect to be working alongside lifeguards and counsellors to ensure campers are engaged in each activity and that lifeguards and counsellors have support and guidance as well as respite when needed. You will participate in Program, helping to engage campers through additional support, modification and encouragement. You will build and maintain relationships with staff and with campers to foster a rewarding camp experience!

The Waterfront Coordinator is a qualified, experienced and safety oriented Head Lifeguard for our summer camp. Maintaining open lines of communication and working in a cooperative manner with other camp staff in fulfilling roles and duties. You will be responsible for overseeing all lifeguards, and for the safe and effective facilitation and supervision of the waterfront area including all waterfront based programming (boating, swimming and outtrip). You will run all emergency waterfront procedures as they arise. Reports directly to the Program Director.

Qualifications:

- Must be 19 years old
- Must be able to provide a Criminal Record Check
- Standard First Aid + CPR + NLS
- Lifeguarding experience
- Lifesaving instructor/examiner, Standard first aid instructor/examiner, ORCA instructor, swim instructor, boating instructor qualifications are all considered assets
- Will receive basic ASL, CPI & consent training. Will be trained on camp procedures.

Responsibilities:

- Responsible for the safety, health, and well-being of campers especially when involved in waterfront programming (swim, boating and outtrip) and improving waterfront accessibility for campers
- Adhere to all health and safety protocols including Covid-19 related policies and procedures
- Assist in the evaluation and supervision of the lifeguards
- Facilitate and directly supervise the waterfront programming while the waterfront is open
- Perform daily opening and closing safety checks of all waterfront equipment and the environment
- Provide maintenance on the beach, clearing the beach of any obstructions, and ensure cleanliness of the beach and beach supplies/equipment
- Respond to waterfront emergencies and facilitate emergency responses effectively, as needed
- Be an active member of the Leadership Team and complete "Manager on Duty" jobs on a rotating schedule
- Attend pre-camp training (in-city and on site) and attend daily meetings while at camp
- Support non-waterfront programming as required
- Other duties as assigned

Skills and Knowledge:

- Previous experience in a supervisory role (preferably in the camp setting)

- Strong communication and teamwork abilities and ability to problem solve effectively
- High energy candidates should be prepared for physical labor of lifting, moving and lots of walking

Title: Dishwasher/Porter - 2 positions available

Location: Gracefield, Quebec

Work Term: June 15th - August 24th

Salary: \$2,700 - 2,800, including Room & Board

Description: Camp Misquah is looking for dedicated and responsible porters for our summer camp. Porters are expected to maintain open lines of communication and work in a cooperative manner with other camp staff in fulfilling roles and duties. Responsibilities include: maintaining cleanliness of the kitchen, kitchen equipment and supplies along with the other kitchen staff. Reports directly to the Head Cook and Assistant Cook.

Why work here?

Camp Misquah hires individuals that are looking to learn skills and gain experience related to their education or future careers, and those that want to make a difference for people with disabilities.

The kitchen is an essential part of camp, ensuring that campers and safe are fed and kept strong, healthy, and energized. By working in the camp kitchen staff will learn and apply a variety of skills and contribute to building a positive and adaptive workplace that facilitates summer camp experience to people of all abilities

How will I learn it?

As a porter you will work as a part of a team in the camp kitchen to prepare meals on all working days for all staff and campers (about 100 people total). You will work under the guidance and direction of the Head Cook to do tasks such as cutting, mixing, etc. to prepare meals and to plate and serve meals. Porters will learn camp dishwashing procedures to clean dishes and learn to operate sanitizing equipment. You will contribute to the maintenance and operation of a safe and efficient kitchen and dining area.

Qualifications:

- Must be able to provide a clear Vulnerable sector police record check
- Standard First Aid + CPR are assets
- Food Safety Certificate must be obtained
- Will be trained on camp and kitchen procedures.

Responsibilities:

• Responsible for the safety, health, and well-being of campers

- Adhere to all Covid-19 related policies and procedures
- Assist in preparing, plating and serving food
- Assist in unpacking and storing food and supplies
- Wash dishes, put dishes through sanitization machine
- Arranging and organizing dishes/cutlery in cupboard and drawers
- Achieve and maintain kitchen area and equipment cleanliness at all times
- Take out and replace garbage
- Sweep and mop dining hall floors and clean tables
- Other duties as assigned

Kitchen Operations
